

Requirements:

Formalize what the design has to accomplish

Function, interaction, character

“The design should...”

Specify the need, not the solution:

–Good: “provide space for a family of six to eat together”

–Bad: “include a dining table in the middle of the room.”

Initial List of Requirements

	The design should:
Safety	Not have pinch points Not have sharp features exposed to users Not be applied to people ...
Function	Not over drive or under drive nails Allow for accurate nail placement Be durable Drive one nail quickly Drive many nails in a session Drive most roofing nails and similar nails, such as for barrier material ...
Interaction	Be accessible to colorblind people Be easy to position Allow a person to use it for a long time without getting fatigued Be ergonomic Be transportable Require only one person to operate Be easy to maintain Allow a person to discover how to use it easily ...
Character	Provide a feeling of satisfaction when operated Appear rugged and durable Have a modern look that fits the other equipment on the site
